



Trade Facilitation - Understanding Implementation Implications of Cross-sectoral from Border Agencies and Business Operators Perspectives

Overview

The course provides an in-depth analysis of the implementation aspects of trade facilitation measures. It zeroes-in on cross- dimensionality of trade facilitation measures at implementation level. It further explores the consequence of trade facilitation with self contained policies arising from sector specific ministries and departments. It take into account implementation level links of trade facilitation measures with the mandates line ministries and agencies. The course focuses on application and implementation aspects of trade facilitation and debunks traditional myth that separates mandates of ministries along social and economic lines. Taking a case study method of interrogation of pertinent policy issues and measures it provides participants with an exposé of best practices in the formulation of policies and implementation of trade facilitation measures on a sectoral and cross sectoral basis. The course will cover multiple sectors, ranging from immigration, agriculture, health, law enforcement agencies, transport, standards, trade, customs etc. The training focuses on specific trade facilitation measures that have a bearing on the viability of trade facilitation measures and contextualizes them in needs and and interest of the business communities and mandates of border agencies. It adopts principles of legitimacy and proportionality in respect various policy interventions with a bearing on trade facilitation.

All key trade facilitation measures will be considered on case study basis from the African continent and experiences and case studies of other jurisdictions will also be considered. The course will be highly applied.
